William Craven Our Local Hero



Across the Autumn Term 1, the children will explore, discover and deepen their knowledge through our exciting curriculum. They will dive into the life of our local hero William Craven finding out his life and legacy. As part of our research we will also find out why and when people first came to settle in Burnsall. Throughout art topic the children will explore the history of portraits and how styles have changed over the ages. We then fast forward into the 20th century to use Pop Art to inspire portrait prints. Through our RE work the children will explore 'The Big Questions' looking at what it is like to be a Hindu in Britain. Throughout the autumn term there will be many different learning outcomes - far too many to list here - but here are a few to look out for.
